Jim Brown introduced our guest speaker, Doug McNally. Doug was the police chief for the City of Edmonton, and since 1995 has been the head of the Edmonton Community foundation, which is a registered charitable foundation. Doug gave us a lot of insight into the operations of the foundation, and the great impact it has on many aspects of life in the city. Doug likened the foundation to a "community savings account", as compared to the many wonderful charities in the city which are like "chequing accounts". The foundation began in 1971 with \$34000 in its coffers. Not much happened to this organization until the late 1980's when a combined donation of \$15 million from three Edmonton families, the Stollery family, and two Poole families, really gave the foundation the start it needed. Since then the foundation has grown its assets to approximately \$140 million, and it has disbursed many millions of dollars over that time. In 2003 alone, nearly \$12 million were raised and \$9 million disbursed to nearly 300 recipients. The fund disburses 4.5% of its total asset value every year.
