President Leon Lubin welcomed 30 Gyro's, one new member applicant and three guests to the July 7^{th} luncheon meeting held at the Royal Mayfair Golf Club.

Bill Taylor led the group in the singing of Cheerio and "Dutch" Hoeksema presented the Grace. Bryce Van Dusen introduced his guest Doug Thomas, Walter Yakimets introduced his guest and new member applicant Jack Slobodan and Allan Warrack introduced our guest speaker Jordi Weidman. New member applicant, Len Stevens was also in attendance.

Marty Larson advised the membership on some of the decisions made at the Gyro International and District IX Convention held in San Diego June 8th-14th. There will be no International dues increase in 2009-2010 due to current financial constraints but in order to keep costs under control the publication of the Gyroscope magazine will be reduced from four paper issues per year to two. At least one further issue of the magazine will be sent via e-mail because most of our members are now on-line. It is also expected that the Bi-Annual Roster will also be sent via the internet, thus giving further savings. The Black Lake and Fresno Club's were able to keep the convention costs in the black by selling 50/50 tickets and by holding a silent auction.

Congratulations to Larry Duba of the Fresno Gyro Club (District IX) who has been elected as Third International Vice President. Larry is the third international officer elected from District-IX, and the second from Fresno.

Treasurer Mike Matei presented the Financial Statements for the Year Ending March 31, 2009 and the proposed Budget for the Year Ending March 31, 2010. The 2010 Budget was approved unanimously on a motion by Chuck Gerhart and seconded by Marty Larson. The Financial Statements for the Year Ending March 31, 2009 were approved unanimously on a motion by Allan Warrack and seconded by Jack Brown.

Allan Warrack introduced our guest speaker Jordi Weidman, Director of Business Operations for the Edmonton Capitals Baseball Club. Jordi was born in Edmonton and began his radio announcing career in Red Deer. Prior to his appointment with the Edmonton Capitals, Jordi was Manager of Communications for the Edmonton Oil Kings for two years which is part of the Edmonton Eskimo's organization.

The Edmonton Capitals are one of 19 teams in the five year-old **Golden Baseball League**. There are no direct ties to the Major Baseball leagues but there are many very talented college-draft players as well as some former major league players who have been recruited by the Golden League.

The Edmonton Capitals, who are part of the Edmonton Eskimo's organization have established as their primary goal to re-establish the connection with the community. There is a fun family focus with a motto of "Have a Ball for Nine Dollars". The "Signature Sunday's" have been very successful with opportunities for the young fans to receive autographs from all of the players, as well as swinging the bats and running the bases.

One of key pillars of the Capital's approach is reasonable prices. Kids have the opportunity to purchase a 20 game ticket package for \$49 and adult admissions have been set at nine dollars for general admission, \$12.50 for reserved seats and \$17 for club seats. The food services approach has been completely revamped with an emphasis on better quality and reasonable prices. A three dollar combo is available every day and on Tuesday's the combo price is \$2. Adults can purchase a hotdog and a beer for six dollars.

The first Friday of each month will be highlighted with fireworks and on Saturday nights there will be baseball movies shown after the game. The baseball movies have been very successful and are shown on an 11 by 20 foot inflatable screen. The business/corporate clientele have shown a very positive response to the picnic area at field level where a hotdog/hamburger and game ticket combo is available. The Executive Suites which are unique in this league have been completely revamped with new cabinetry and carpeting.

The Capital's have targeted a 1700-2000 average per game attendance and to date have averaged 1900 attendees per game. The salaries of each of the Capitals players have been negotiated within an overall season budget for the players of \$83,000. The players drive and enthusiasm must be based on their love of the game and not their pay cheque!

Chuck Gerhart thanked Jordi for his very enthusiastic and informative presentation. The Free Lunch draw was won by Mike Matei.

Allan and Jean Warrack returned home from a visit to Halifax, Nova Scotia in late June and advised of their visit with relatives to Hubbards, Nova Scotia for an "old tyme lobster feed" at the Shore Club. A dance hall and restaurant, the Shore Club was built in 1946 by Roy Harnish on his cow pasture overlooking Hubbards Cove. The history of lobster feeds by the Harnish family goes back even further to 1936 when Guy Harnish was asked to cater a Lobster Supper for the National Gyro Club Convention. In his cattle barn, Guy had been using a large copper kettle as a feed trough for his cows. The copper kettle had been the cook pot aboard the U.S. Frigate "The Chesapeake". During a famous battle on June 1, 1813, the British ship,

"The Shannon" sailed into Boston Harbour and challenged the Chesapeake. The battle only lasted 15 minutes, with the victorious Shannon towing the Chesapeake back to Halifax, where her chattels were sold at public auction. The large copper pot ended up in the possession of Guy Harnish, and in 1936 cooked its first meal in over 120 years.


The Gyro fraternity in Nova Scotia is still thriving with clubs located in Dartmouth, Kentville, New Glasgow, Truro and Windsor.
