At our last meeting on 1 February 1994 we were privileged to have as our guest speaker, a very eminent member of the medical profession, in the person of Dr. David C. Reid, who was introduced by Gerry Glassford.

Dr. Reid was born in Bristol, England and graduated from the Prince of Wales Hospital London, England in 1963 with a Diploma in Physiotheraphy. He subsequently obtained a Teacher's Diploma in Physiotheraphy from the University of Toronto; graduated with honours. He studied at the University of Alberta, gaining both a Baccalaureate degree and a Doctor of Medicine with Distinction.

He obtained a fellowship in the Royal College of Surgeons of Canada in 1979, and a specialist certificate in Orthopedic Surgery. In 1980 a Master of Surgery was obtained from the University of Liverpool.

Dr. Reid is currently Professor of Orthopedic Surgery, Adjunct Professor of Rehabilitation Medicine; and Director of the Glen Sather University of Alberta Sports Medicine Clinic.

The subject of his talk and slide presentation was generally about sports.injuries, particularly regarding the knee. We learned that knee injuries are most common in many sports, which are dealt with in increasing degrees of success by orthopedic specialists.

Apparently only a few years ago, a torn medial meniscus of the knee, or cruicate problems required surgical removal of the affected area. Now with the current arthroscopic surgery, which requires relatively small incisions; orthopedic surgeons are now able to repair the injury, as opposed to excision of the affected part.

We were also privileged to witness on videotape, some of the various knee operations that Dr. Reid had performed; and to appreciate to some degree, his outstanding ability and the amazing results of arthroscopic surgery.

Our special thanks to Gerry Glassford for arranging Dr. Reid's visit, and to Jack Ellis for nicely expressing the thanks of those present.

We had one very interested guest, Sandy Rennie, who is Assistant Professor & Clinical __Co=ordinator, Department of Physical Theraphy, Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine at the University of Alberta. He was introduced by his dad, Gord.
