Vice-President Ray Dallaire welcomed 36 Gyros and two guests to the September 20th luncheon meeting held at the Royal Mayfair Golf Course. Jack Little led the group in the singing of Cheerio and David Burnett gave the Grace. Alan Rusler introduced his guest, Bill Page.

Taras Chmil introduced our guest speaker, Shami Sandhu, former Chairman of the Edmonton Police Commission. After completing his post-secondary education, Shami began his career in aviation management. Upon leaving the aviation industry in 2002, he became a Realtor and in 2008 became the broker/owner of RE/MAX River City. He has helped grow his company from a single office with 60 associates to more than 130 in three locations. Shami was awarded the Canadian Broker/Owner of the Year Award in 2012 and the Community Care Award in 2010.

Shami's strong commitment to his community has been very strong. Since 2009, RE/MAX River City has been the top contributing office to the Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation. RE/MAX River City is a Miracle Office that raises more than \$100,000 annually with every associate donating a portion of every transaction.

Shami's volunteer efforts have ranged from coaching his kids' soccer team, to serving on the boards for his community league and area council and most recently serving on the board of Edmonton's Food Bank. In December 2015, Shami completed his six-year term on the Edmonton Police Commission, where he served as chair for the last three years.

Mr. Sandhu advised that the Edmonton Police Commission is a non-political body that provides civilian oversight of the Edmonton Police Service. The Commission has four main functions: overseeing the police service, responding to citizens' concerns on policing matters, helping to develop the annual policing plan and budget, and building positive relationships with community partners. There are nine appointed members with fixed terms and two Edmonton City Councillor's who sit as advisors. Board members have a variety of backgrounds including medical, legal and business.

The Commission is responsible for the recruiting and selection of the Police Chief and submits their recommendation to City Council for approval. The City Council almost always approves the Commission's choice for Chief. There has been only one instance where the recommended candidate was not approved. The Chief brings his choice for Deputy Chief to the Commission. Regular surveys are undertaken every two years to gauge public opinion on policing and public safety concerns.

The budget cycle begins in April/May with strategic planning and the development of a vision which is presented to the Chief and Deputies. The plan with dollars is returned with a line by line review undertaken in August. The Plan is then submitted to City Council. City Council cannot pick and choose specific elements of the proposed plan but can set the total budget allocation.

More and more Edmonton citizens are reporting crime online which reduces the need for community police stations. Sometimes a police response is not appropriate and the Commission will suggest changes in legislation such as those speeders that exceed the speed limit by 50 km or more.

Police clientele are the bad, the mad and the sad.

The so called "frequent flyers" have been identified because they have issues with a large number of city agencies. Some offenders are involved in 150-200 police responses annually. In many cases these offenders have health issues and are homeless. City agencies are now working with the police service to find longer-term solutions for these individuals.

Edmonton is unique with an internal auditor that reports to the Commission. Munitions and weapons are subject to an annual audit along with crime evidence such as drugs, weapons and vehicles.

The Commission has had some successes with a more efficient budget process and a faster response time for public complaint investigations. The traditional 16-month response to public complaints has been reduced to 12 months.

There are now more unsworn civilians working in the Edmonton Police Service who can do many of the tasks such as information technology and budgeting. There are presently three Deputy Chiefs; the new deputy chief responsible for administration will be a civilian. Sworn police officers will concentrate on policing and unsworn civilians will assist in non-policing areas. The new hiring emphasis is on smarter recruits as opposed to brawn.

Ken Willan thanked our speaker for an informative and entertaining presentation.
