THOMAS WILLIAM CHAMBERS. P. Eng.

Tom Chambers graduated from the University of Toronto in 1952 with a BASc in Mining Engineering. Following graduation, he accepted a position with Shell Oil Company and worked as a Petroleum Engineer and Operations Supervisor in oil fields throughout Alberta and Saskatchewan.

Mr. Chambers has been a member of APEGGA since 1957. During the mid-1960's he was involved in career counselling for the Association, followed by service on the Membership Committee of which he eventually became Chairman. From 1972 to 1973 he served on council. Mr. Chambers received the APEGGA Special Award In 1978 which recognizes members who have made outstanding contributions to society.

Mr. Chambers served as the MIA for Edmonton Calder from 1971 to 1986 and as Minister of Housing and Public Works (1972 - 1982) and Public Works, Supply and Services (1982 -- 1996), and was Chairman of the Board of the Alberta Housing Corporation and the Alberta Home Mortgage Corporation.

A highlight of Mr. Chambers' political career was his Involvement with the construction of the 1998 Winter Olympic facilities in and surrounding the City of Calgary.

In 1970, Tom and Lenore Chambers founded Chambers Engineering Ltd - a consulting engineering firm primarily dedicated to petroleum production optimization. Except during his service as a minister of the crown, Mr. Chambers was President and CEO of the f@ until his retirement in 1996.

Mr. Chambers was elected to the position of First Vice President, APEGGA, in 1987 and served as President in 1988-89.

In addition to his work with APECYGA, he has been involved over the years with many community and service organizations including the YMCA, junior Achievement,

the RCAF Association and the 745 Communication Squadron (Reserve) where he served as Honorary Lieutenant Colonel,

Mr. Chambers established a scholarship fund for University of Alberta 2nd and 3rd year engineering students, Three or four scholarships of \$1500.00 each per year have been awarded since 1988-89.

Mr. Chambers has served on the board of directors of a number of organizations including Syncrude Canada Ltd (also a member of the Management Committee) during construction of the oil sands project, Millar Western Pulp Ltd. and Torex Resources Inc., He was a Founding Director and Vice Chairman of The Science Alberta Foundation, and Public Representative on the Council of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Alberta.

Tom and Lenore have four children and eleven grandchildren.

At the last meeting past president Bruce Foy officiated because President Larry, while recovering well from his operation, is still a little weak of voice. John Plunkett led us in Cheerio and Rev. John Dowds asked the blessing.

President Larry introduced his guest Win Kirkwood. There were 25 Gyros at the meeting.
