Station call letters at 1480 AM soon to be 101.9 FM. The station presents ethnic material - is a licensed commercial station and receives no government support; and, is licensed by the Federal Government to broadcast in no less than 20 languages - carries no Native programming. Broadcasts 24 hours daily 7 days per week.

Diana also spoke at length of the numbers and types of ethnic groups in our City and Province. She showed "directories" of members of the various groups including Asian, Polish, Italian and Spanish.

The directories are usually prepared within a particular community and, in addition to being useful to those living within the area, are also useful to marketers and others doing business there.

The Chinese and East Indian communities are growing rapidly here, with more air time being sold to them all the time.

Diana gave us a great deal of information in her allotted time. It was an excellent presentation.

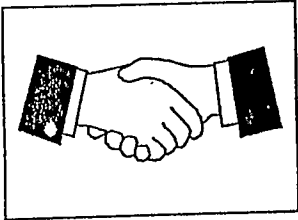
