Founders Night. In attendance were nine members of the Sherwood Park Club, eight from St Albert, and forty nine from the Edmonton Club. David Burnett introduced his guest Frits

Pannekoek, the President of Athabasca University.

Roger Russell led us in Cheerio and Dick Nichols asked the blessing.

District VIII Governor Eric Braun installed two new members of the Edmonton Club, Warren Garbutt and Bill

Taylor. We welcome the new members to our club.

PIP Marty Larson paid tribute to the three founders of Gyro. The 3 originals were Ed Kagy, Paul Schwan and Gus Handerson. Paul Schwan, the great organizer, was not around very long. He joined the US Army on April 1, 1918 and died 16 days later as the great flu epidemic swept the world. Gus Handerson produced the first club bulletin, and named it the Gyroscope. He stayed active in Gyro for a number of years, but retired early and moved to Florida. The Grey Eagle, Ed Kagy, was to remain active in Gyro for many years, becoming our first paid secretary-treasurer in 1923. He remained active until his death in 1960.

In Edmonton, the original founders included Reg Henry and Alex Mitchell, and a number of men who rose to prominence in our community in later years. Nelles Buchanan, later a judge in the Northern Alberta Court, was the first member of our club to be a district governor.

Alex Mitchell was the first Honor Key winner from Edmonton, in 1939, followed by Roy Miller in 1950, PIP Russ Carter in 1953 and Gord Rennie in 1985. We have had 11 Merit award winners and two Hubbell award winners.

Marty suggested that we all have founders in our own clubs that we could recognize at this event, and that includes current

people – such as long term club officers, event organizers, district officers, new member leaders – who could be recognized.

Dick Nichols introduced our guest speakers Leigh and Aline MacMillan who spent three years in Saudi Arabia. They provided an interesting and extensive slide presentation on their various experiences in the country. They both worked at the hospital in Riyadh and shared information about living as expatriates in this male dominated culture. They also showed us the geography, historical sites, cultural and architectural points of interest etc. Leigh and Aline also gave us some insights as to how the expatriates celebrated Christmas in the desert and their other efforts enjoy recreational pursuits in the desert. **President Walter** thanked the speakers on our behalf.
