Our guest speaker, our own Gyro Larry Wang was introduced by Gerry Glassford. Larry gave a very interesting presentation on the Ecological Conservancy Outreach Fund. Larry has been involved with this project in China since his retirement from the University in 2000.

Larry's presentation was truly fascinating as it covered the rehabilitation of devastated areas in China including Beijing. Currently, there are 12 ongoing projects in China which cover diverse areas including:

- Flood Control due to silt accumulation with the participation of the Chinese Academy for Forestry
- The planting of mulberry trees for silk production, which in turn increased the local farmers income by 40% and provided a generous income to the villagers, who are very poor;
- Planting of fast growing bamboo trees to prevent erosion which in • turn provides four to five times the income than rice plantation;

The use of soil from the subway construction for land preservation.

- Larry also indicated that the success of this project is due to:
 - Private Donors
 - Strong network with all levels of Chinese government
 - Strong technical support from the University of Alberta
 - Education of local farmers •

• Project sustainability and volunteer co-operation

Another interesting aspect of the project is that the Chinese hold Canadians in very high esteem; as a matter of fact, Larry indicated that the Chinese treated Larry and his team as the new Dr. Norman Bethune.
