Jack Ellis reported on the Health of the Club and advised that **Dave Duchak** is recovering well and hopes to be out to the next meeting.

Past District Governor, **Gerry Glassford** carried out the Induction ceremony with the assistance of sponsor, Walter Yakimets for our new member **Aurelio Fernandes.** Aurelio was then welcomed personally by each member in attendance.

President **Fred** advised the members that the prescribed written notice of six weeks to the proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws, January 15th, 2007 had been given in the Gyrolog dated January 28th, 2007.

Feedback to the proposed amendments has been generally positive with six responses received. Each of the issues, comments and suggested additional amendments were described by President Fred and three new amendments to the January 15th, 2007 proposal were presented for approval.

The membership approved the three new amendments to Article IX-Finance, Fees and Dues, Clause 5a) and Article VIII- Club Meetings, Clauses 3 and 5.

The Constitution and By-Laws Amended March 20, 2007 are now in effect.

Tony Sheppard introduced our guest speaker **Jim Hutton** who is a Board Member of the **Centre for Family Literacy** and is also involved with the City Centre Education Project sponsored by the Edmonton Public Schools.

Mr. Hutton advised that we must focus more energy on literacy skills for people already living in Alberta as opposed to concentrating on bringing more workers in to the province. Many of the public assume that we have a high literacy rate of 99%. The sad reality is that 36% of Albertans do not have the literacy skills to perform simple tasks and 21% function at a level 2, below what is required for simple tasks.

Poor literacy skills are devastating. Complex instructions are not able to be read and can be hazardous to life. People with low literacy must rely on others to complete simple tasks. People with low literacy skills use up larger amounts of services from helping organizations and are more likely to end up in criminal activities at a huge cost to society.

Impacts can be seen in many special programs required by those with poor literacy. Poor literacy equals poor productivity. Additional costs are incurred and safety becomes a significant issue. Many people with poor literacy are homeless.

Literacy programs focus on the family as a platform for growth of literacy. Literate parents are more likely to raise literate children. Early childhood programs are a key element with emphasis on pre-kindergarten to grade three. Problems can be found in poor as well as professional families. For many families the Edmonton Classroom on Wheels is the only reading resource available to them.

Awareness must be raised to advance the cause for literacy as will improve the lives of everyone. Funding is a key issue and the Centre is always looking for volunteers in many capacities.

Peter Butler thanked our speaker on behalf of the members.
