Second Vice-President, Dunc Mills welcomed 30 Gyros, new member applicant, **Hank Mottl** and our guest speaker to the March 3rd luncheon meeting held at the University (Faculty) Club. **Arv Hardin** led the singing of Cheerio and **Jim Lochhead** presented the Grace.

Dunc Mills provided information on his recent visit to Mobile, Alabama where the first Mardi Gras was celebrated in 1703. It was revived after the Civil War when citizen Joe Cain, fed up with post-war misery, led an impromptu parade down city streets. Mobile has been doing it ever since and they mark the annual occasion with majestic parades, colourful floats and flying Moon Pies. Mardi Gras celebrations begin two and a half weeks before Fat Tuesday and the Port City comes to life. Elaborate themed floats manned by masked mystic societies, mounted police and marching bands wind through downtown Mobile and surrounding areas, entertaining nearly a million revelers each year.

Dunc passed out various strings of coloured beads and packages of moon pies that have been made since 1917.

Daryl Dyck introduced our guest speaker, **Dr. Kevin Engel, Optometrist** who resides in Lacombe Alberta. Dr. Engel is married with a family of three children and is an avid competitive water skier.

Dr. Engel advised that he had a cancer scare 10 years ago which would have drastically reduced his income. He wanted to have income even if he was sick and began to talk with people who had financial savvy. He also read several books including "Rich Dad, Poor Dad" and the "Canadian Real Estate Retirement Plan" to gain a better understanding of the real estate market.

Engel then focused on purchasing four houses that provided rental income of \$50-60,000 per year. He then ultimately acquired 68 rental properties. However, over the last two years rents have fallen and he needed to diversify again. This diversification included looking for property that still had a good cash flow in a "down market".

Dr. Engel had avoided large commercial and residential properties because it is much easier to liquidate individual houses. He uses a property manager and has been able to establish a successful passive income generation in multiple streams. This approach has provided family security in the event he not able to rely on his optometry practice.

Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL) 100th **Anniversary Project**

Allan Bolstad and **Project Manager, Nora Begoray** presented information on **The EFCL 100**th **Anniversary Project** at the January 7th, 2020 Luncheon Meeting.

The Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL), which is represents 160 Community Leagues in Edmonton, will be 100 years old in 2021. To celebrate this milestone, the EFCL is working with the City of Edmonton on a significant upgrade to Hawrelak Park. The Project consists of two plaza spaces that anchor a man-made stream complete with pathways, interpretive nodes, seating opportunities, and interactive play elements.

The components of the project tell the story of the EFCL's history and celebrate the many contributions that this organization and its members have made to communities in the Edmonton area.

The Executive Committee met on January 21st and agreed to recommend to the membership that \$1000 be donated to the EFCL 100th Anniversary Project from the Benevolence Fund in the 2019-20 fiscal year.

An email polling of the membership on March 16 and 17 resulted in a majority vote responding in the affirmative with no votes against.

The GYRO CLUB of EDMONTON FUND

In January 2007, an **Ad Hoc Benevolence Fund Committee** was established to develop a long-term plan for the management of this fund. The Committee completed their work in January 2008 and recommended that the club continue to support children through the building of playgrounds. The best use of the club's Benevolence Fund would to be to establish an endowment fund managed by the Edmonton Community Foundation. The existing Lee Community

Playspace Fund would be used as our field of interest and a new **Gyro Club of Edmonton Fund** would be set up. The annual interest generated by this fund would be used to provide playground equipment to upgrade those Edmonton inner-city community play spaces that are fully open to the public.

A formal fund agreement was signed with the **Edmonton Community Foundation** on **April 15th, 2008** with a contribution of \$16,500. Tribute gifts given to honour departed Gyro Club members and interest accruing to the fund had increased its value to over \$21,000 in 2011. An additional \$4000 was donated to the fund in 2013.

The balance of the fund at the beginning of 2019 was \$39,788. Donations received were \$2057, net investment income was \$4,393 grants were \$1590, operating expenses were \$314, leaving a balance at the end of 2019 Of \$44,334. Funds available to grant in 2020 are \$1,773.

Past President Bruce Swanson moved, and Larry Dobson seconded the motion on March 19th to recommend a Proposed Slate of Officers for May 1, 2020 to April 30, 2021. Members were asked to respond to the motion by email. A majority of the members have responded in the affirmative with no objections.

Members were asked in an email on March 21st to consider the budget proposal and vote on the motion. A majority of the members have voted to approve the budget and there were no objections.


