President Ron Trant gave a brief history of Valentines:

The saint we celebrate on <u>Valentine's Day</u> is known officially as St. Valentine of Rome in order to differentiate him from the dozen or so other Valentines on the list. Because "Valentinus"—from the Latin word for worthy, strong, or powerful—was a popular moniker between the second and eighth centuries.

English poet **Geoffrey Chaucer** published "Parliament of Fowls," a poem declaring Valentine's Day as the time where birds choose their mates. The poem seemingly sparked a tradition for lovers to send romantic letters to each other during bird mating season. These messages, called valentines, grew in popularity, and were mass-produced by the late 1700s.

Saint Valentina, Saint-Valentine, martyred 308. Christian virgin martyr from Caesarea, Palestine. Burnt on an altar tied to her sister Saint Thea in 308 AD.

Valentine is also known as the Patron Saint of beekeepers and epilepsy.

There are several different dates besides February 14th in which Valentines is celebrated. In Wales, it is celebrated on January 25th, In Argentina, the Week of Sweetness is celebrated in July and in Spain, the Day of Love is held on October 9th.

Dunc Mills reported on his visit to Wallace, Idaho on February 3rd to install the new Executive and Directors of the Wallace Gyro Club.

Wallace, founded in 1884, is the principal town of the Coeur d'Alene silver-mining district, which produced more silver than any other mining district in the United States.

The Wallace Gyro Club **received their charter in 1934** and is the last of the Gyro Club's operating in the U.S portion of District VIII. Kellogg and Coeur d'Alene Idaho, and Spokane, Washington were previous clubs.

The club currently has 38 members ranging in age from the mid 20's to the mid 80's. This is a remarkable age spread given the total population of 850 in Wallace. In the last year, five new members have joined with only one resignation.

The Lead Creek Derby has been held annually since 1942 and is organized by the Wallace Gyro Club. A large, inflated plastic ball is dropped into the South fork of the Coeur d'Alene River in Mullan and floats downstream to Wallace with the help of brave Gyros who must climb down the slippery slopes to extract the ball wedged in bushes or trees. Each buyer of the derby ticket is assigned a time when the ball may reach the finish line. The first prize is 50 Silver Rounds.

In June 2022, **22,000 one-dollar tickets were sold**. The finds raised by the Gyros are used to fund scholarships for grade 12 students graduating from Wallace and Mullan High Schools, as well as other civic and youth activities.

Gyro Club of Edmonton-Gerontology Scholarships 2023

In the mid-1980's to mid-1990's, funds were contributed by the Gyro Club of Edmonton, and individual members with matching funds from the province to establish the **Centre for Gerontology Fund** at the University of Alberta. This endowment fund currently provides yearly; one undergraduate scholarship of \$1,000 and a Masters of \$1700 and a PhD scholarship of \$1800. The winners of this year's scholarships are:

- Gyro Club Undergraduate Scholarship in Aging \$1000
 Zachary Klarenbach, Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry-Physiology, Long-term goal is to become a geriatrician, working with older adults in cancer care and radiation therapy.
