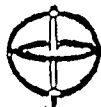

GUEST SPEAKER: St. Albert's own **Mike Matei** introduced the guest speaker, the Executive Director of the Victorian Order of Nurses, **Jean Greschuk**. She explained that since government had taken over much of the home care nursing, the VON has moved farther afield. The VON has been in Canada since 1897 and in Alberta since 1909.

The home visiting nursing program provides medical treatments, health surveillance and monitoring of medications for people who are not eligible for government programs. The adult day health care program assists families to care for older people who are frail or people with disabilities in their homes. This provides relief for those providing care to their family members. The people in crisis program works in local crisis shelters to break the cycle of family violence. The footcare program helps to "keep Canadians on their feet". Since painful feet can limit independence, this service assists people to remain active. There are 40 clinics throughout Edmonton, yet there are still waiting lists at some times. The occupational health programs works with employers to care for the health needs of workers and provides health promotion to enable workers to understand and protect their own health.

Two of the fundraising efforts of the VON are the Entertainment Books and selling Christmas cakes. The Bee Belle bakery provides the cakes at cost and they were very popular last year. A major event is the Victorian Gala to which Gyro's are invited.

The VON is involved in teaching community health as well as having precept students during the academic year. The staff of VON are loyal and committed and stay for a long time even though they are not paid as highly as other nurses.

HEALTH: **Bert Boren** reported that **John Boychuk** has decided to cancel his second cataract operation. **Dan Lawton** is in Victoria and is expected back next month. He also reported with regret that **Louis Tremblay** passed away - a minute of silence was observed in his honour.
