Report on Gyro International Convention held in Milwaukee hospitality was great there will not be a fee increase for Gyro International for the coming year. The Edward "Ed" Steinbacher Award - This new Award is given not only to somebody who has made significant contributions to Gyro in the current year but who has given unstintingly of his time, efforts and love in perpetuating Gyro and all it stands for over the course of 20 years or more, a Gyro who reflects the essence of friendship and has literally, offered a "lifetime" to the success of the organization. The plaque contains the following: "In recognition of Extraordinary, Magnanimous and Perpetual Service to the Gyro Fraternity of Friendship". The winner was Marty Larson of our Club. Congratulations Marty!!! There was also another Jim Parker.

The best bulletin Award from International went to **Don Greig** of Sherwood Park Club **Rikke Dootjes**, member of the Sherwood Park Gyro Club, is in the running for one of the Manning Awards on his work on the mini scleral contact lens Article in the Edmonton Journal July 28, 2005.

Guest Speaker for todays luncheon - Brad Assheton-Smith (his Buddhist name is Ajan Yatiko) from the Buddhist Monastery, Kanchanaburi Province, Thailand. The Monastery is near the site of "The Bridge over the River Kwai" Brad was introduced by **David Burnett**.

Brad was born in Edmonton into a Lutheran family and has been a Buddhist Monk for almost 14 years. Brad was a sickly child suffering from severe asthma and this event led him to question why there was suffering in the world. He became interested in spirituality, an interest that waned during his later teens, but then became interested in Religion again. He spent some time in a Catholic Monastery in Quebec but left the monastery and became interested in Buddhism.

His original Buddhist teacher was from Tibet. Enroute to Tibet he had a stopover in Bangkok for 2-3 days. While in Bangkok he met a North American Buddhist and decided to stay in Thailand. His original plan was to be ordained a monk for one year and then return to Canada. His "one year" stay has now been extended to14 years. Buddhist Monk life is one of Renunciation. Monks are celibate. They have no money and are not allowed to ask for money or for that matter anything. He lives in a forest monastery (as opposed to a city one). There is not electricity and the telephone is used only for emergencies. They live in small grass huts. Their time is spent in meditation and study.

They get up at 4:00 am and meditate and then go to the village with a bowl to get donations of food (they cannot ask for food - they go with a bowl and the village feeds them) for their one meal of the day which has to be eaten between daybreak and mid day. Food cannot be stored overnight in the monastery. After their meal they study. They have group tea in the afternoon. In the evening there is more meditation in the hut.

Concepts. Is Buddhism a religion? Doubtful since Buddha is not a god. In Buddhism one trains ones mind how to contemplate and how to use ones mind wisely so as to become enlightened. One may contemplate "is there life after death?", "what is suffering?", etc.

Guidance to lay people: Five precepts (these are offered as advice and not as "thou halt not." refrain from murder, refrain from stealing refrain from sexual misconduct refrain from false speech refrain from drugs and alcohol that lead to recklessness i.e., how to behave in life.

Concepts. Three Stages: Morality - obey precepts Meditation - train mind Understanding - learn how to contemplate - Need to eliminate hatred, greed and delusion.

On a more personal note Brad (Ajan Yatiko) is the senior monk in the Monastery i.e., the Abbot. He has not renounced Christianity as Christianity and Buddhism do not have the same goals. He cannot touch a woman e.g., he cannot shake hands with a woman. He belongs to the most Orthodox of the Buddhist sects.

John Plunkett thanked Brad and gave him our usual gift.

President Walter thanked Bill Clarke, David Burnett and John Plunkett for organizing the meeting.

There were 34 members and guests were present at the meeting.
