The Guest speaker Tom Hutchison was formally introduced by **Harry Kocil**; **Tom** is the *President* of The Edmonton Chapter of *Dreams Take Flight*, serving the area from **Red Deer** north to the **Arctic Circle**



Dreams Take Flight is a charitable *wing* of Air Canada staffed entirely by volunteers with no salaried employees, helping to keep administrative costs at less than 5%, and providing eight flights per year to "Disneyland", for children 6 to 12 years of age but ideally 7 to 11. Children are selected from currently 23 agencies, to name just a few:

Big Brothers-Fort McMurray Boys and Girls Club Edmonton Crystal Kids Glendale School Kids with cancer society Stollery Children's Hospital

The budget for Edmonton's 2006 flight was approximately \$130,000.00 Volunteers are made up from the Air Canada family along with family and friends from the community who *fundraise* throughout the year to make the trip possible.

The 126 children on the 2006 flight came from a variety of communities including Yellowknife, Grand Prairie, Fort McMurray, High Prairie, Red Deer and Edmonton and surrounding areas.

The trips are one day events departing very early in the morning and returning late at night, the ratio of children to adults on each flight is approximately 6 to 1, 2 volunteer doctors and 3 nurses accompany them also.
