GUEST SPEAKER

Harry Nash introduced our guest speaker Roy Bricker who is the Vice President and Chief Operating Office of Casino ABS Roy graduated from the U of A with an Honours B. A. and also received a Master of Arts in Criminology from Pepperdine University. Roy started his career as a Probation Officer with the Department of the Attorney General in 1969. In 1986 Roy became the Executive Director of Corporate Services. In 1980 he moved to the Alberta Liquor Control Board and was responsible for the privatization of liquor retailing in Alberta. In 1995 the ALCB merged with Gaming to become the Alberta Gaming and Commission. Roy rose to the level of Chief Executive Office prior to joining Casino ABS in February, 2000.

Roy gave us both the government and private perspective of gaming in Alberta. Alberta is the only province in Canada that has a charitable casino model. There are 16 casinos in Alberta with 4 in Edmonton, 1 in St. Albert and one being considered in the future(probably Leduc). Charitiable organizations have received \$43 million from the casinos in 1997, \$77 million in 1999-2000 and \$122 million in 2002-2003. Most of the funding increases have come from the broader use of slot machines. There are over 15,000 registered charties in Alberta that benefit from the casinos.
